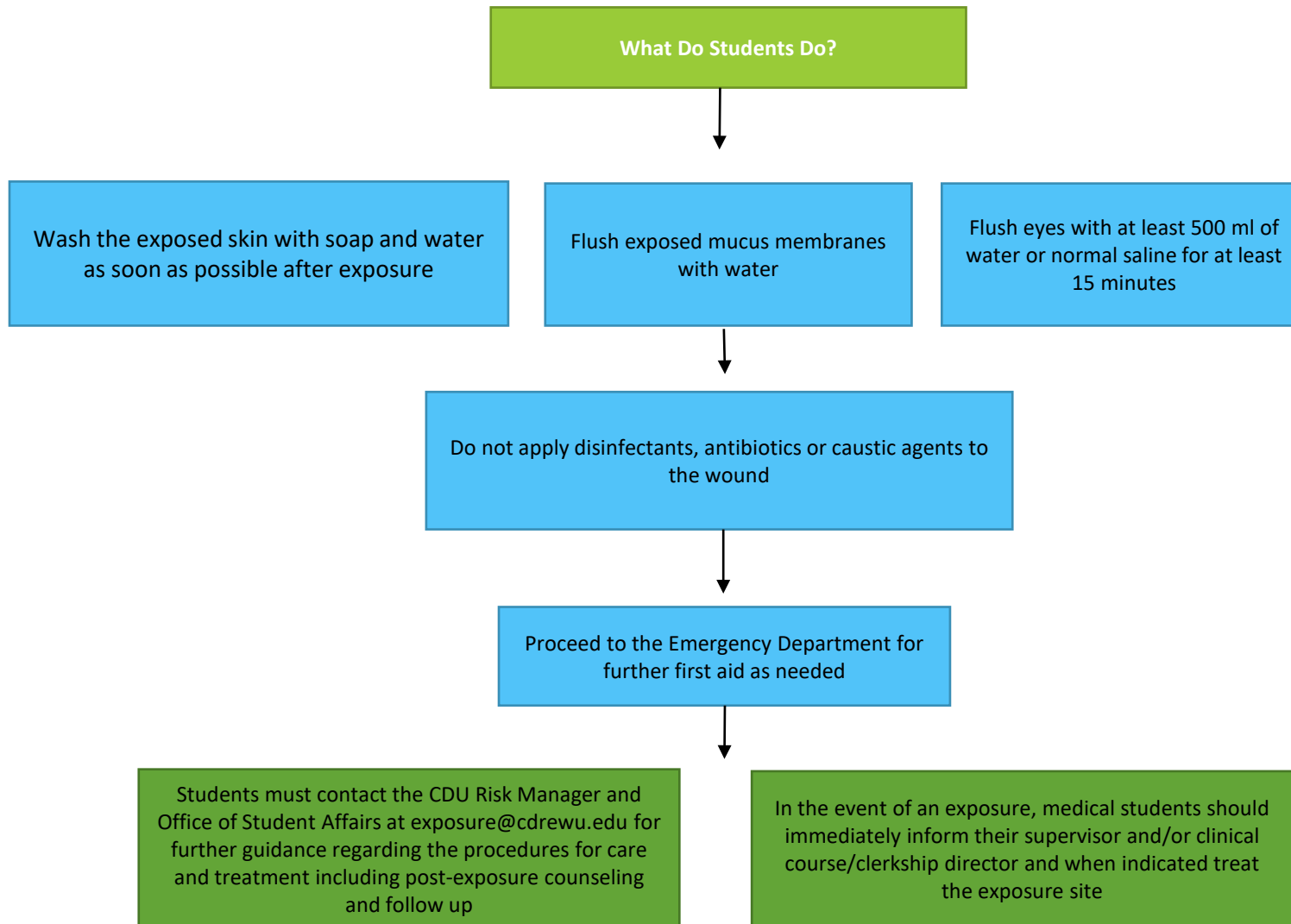

Student Procedure for Care and Treatment after Exposure

All College of Medicine students may use the following procedure to report and address needle stick exposures



Who Pays?

AAMC Agreement The SCHOOL will define, for its medical students, who bears financial responsibility for any charges generated.

a. All CDU students are required to maintain active health insurance to cover health needs related to such exposure.

b. Submission of fees and expenses related to follow-up for student CDU exposure are the responsibility of the student and should be submitted to the student's health insurance carrier for payment. All CDU students are required to maintain active health insurance to cover health needs related to such exposure. Worker's Compensation is not applicable for students.

c. For any medical fees and expenses related to the exposure not covered by the student's health insurance will be covered by CDU. A request for payment or reimbursement must be submitted by email to exposure@cdrewu.edu along with an itemized bill, Explanation of Benefits (EOB) from insurance company, and a paid receipt to the Office of Student Affairs within 30 days from the date the student's insurance claim is approved/denied.

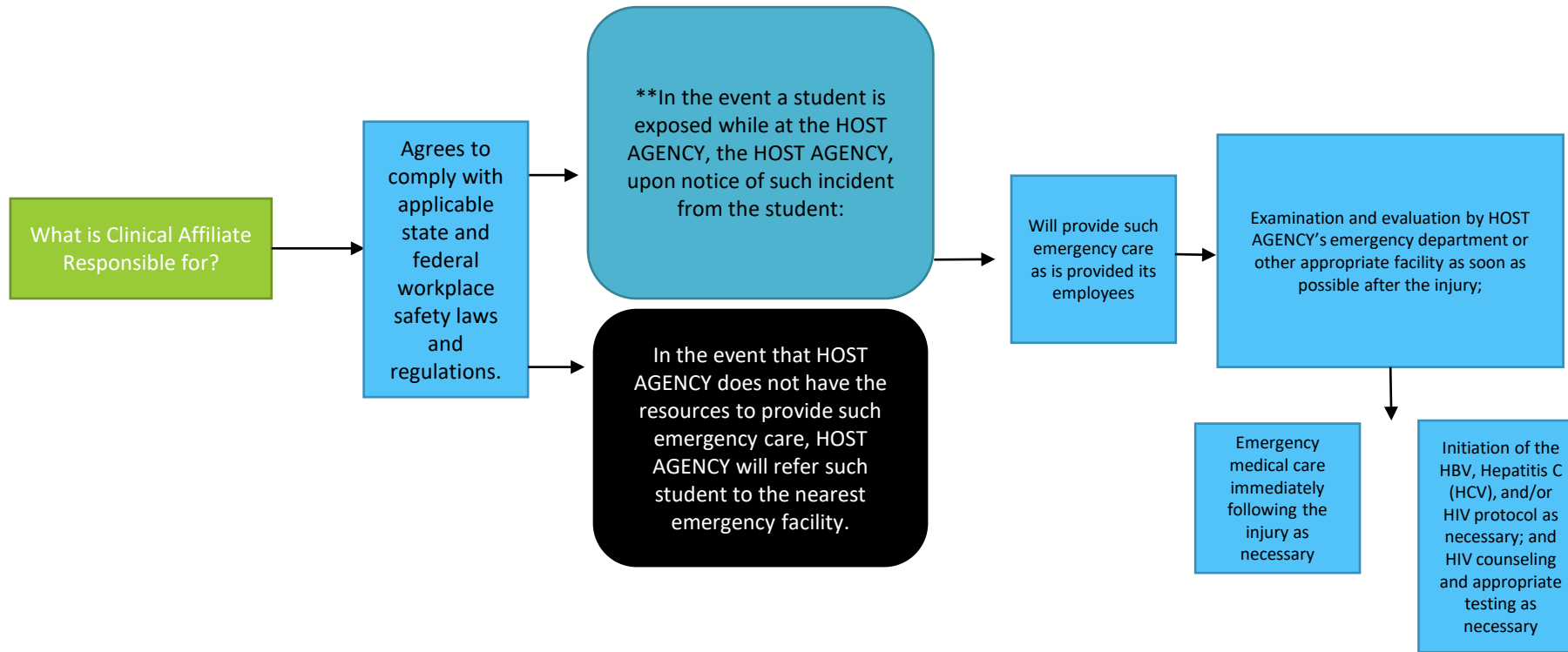
